# VAT BLOW INCREASES GRADE'S PROFILE

The Listed Places of Worship Grants Scheme has historically ensured that where restoration works are undertaken to a Listed building used for worship all the VAT is recoverable from the government. With a rate of 20% this has always been a welcome and valuable bonus.

The UK Government has decided that the Listed Places of Worship Grants Scheme will be renewed for one year — until 2026 and that a spending cap will now apply of £25,000 that can be claimed through the scheme. The overall budget of the scheme has been reduced by almost half to £23 million.

The National Churches Trust believe the scheme offers tremendous value for money. For every £1 invested in a church building, £16 of social good is generated. They believe that the scheme should be made permanent and are working with the Government to ensure the value of these buildings is understood.

As the leading UK church heritage charity, the National Churches Trust are doing all they can to urge the Government to make the scheme permanent and reverse the cuts and the budget cap.

Unfortunately no-one has any idea what will happen in 2026. It may be that the £25,000 cap will continue, it may be that there will be no contribution towards VAT at all.

The National Churches Trust are encouraging everyone to lobby their MP and we have made representations to Andrew George MP. Here is a link where they provide a template:
